

**UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
HONOLULU COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND THE
UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I-WEST O'AHU**

**Associate in Applied Science in Administration of Justice
Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration with a Concentration in Justice Administration**

The purpose of this Agreement is to facilitate the transfer of Administration of Justice (AJ) students from Honolulu Community College to the University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu. Students who complete Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degrees in Administration of Justice at Honolulu Community College may transfer to the University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu's Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration with a Concentration in Justice Administration with modified requirements as described below. (Specific requirements for both the AAS degree and BA degree are provided as attachments.)

Honolulu Community College AAS in Administration of Justice students who transfer to the University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu without completing the University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu articulation option will be required to complete additional courses for their bachelor of arts degree. These students will not be able to transfer with the benefits of this articulation agreement.

Effective Fall 2007, Honolulu Community College agrees to require that students pursuing the UH-West O'ahu articulation option to:

- **Complete 30 credits in AJ courses:** 24 credits as required for the AJ degree; the other 6 credits to be selected from the list on Attachment I.
- **Complete 30 credits of liberal arts courses numbered 100 and above:** 15 of these credits will be used to meet Honolulu Community College's General Education requirements; the other 15 credits of 100+ level courses will be specified electives to complete general education requirements for UH-West O'ahu.


The University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu agrees to allow students who have completed the AAS Administration of Justice degree at Honolulu Community College under the University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu articulation option (as described above) to:

- **Reduce the number of Public Administration credits required from 39 to 27.** The 27 credit Public Administration core must be completed (including capstone PUBA 486 or 490). 12 credits normally required for the Justice Administration Concentration, including PUBA 409, will be waived. (See Attachment II)
- **Consider its general education core to have been met with the completion of PUBA 341 Statistics for Decision-Making in Public Administration, BUSA 320 Statistics for Decision-Making, or SSCI 310 Applied Statistics I and Hum 310 Writing Skills.** (Hum 310 may be waived with a passing score on the Writing Assessment Exam, or with a grade of "C" or better in appropriate coursework).

- **Require students to meet all other degree and graduation requirements** (e.g., three credits of upper division Social Science elective courses, nine credits of upper division writing intensive courses, and upper division electives as necessary, to meet the minimum 54 upper division credits). Courses recommended for electives are provided (see Attachment II).
- **UH West O'ahu advising staff and faculty will work with students on additional Bachelor degree or Certificate options that will augment educational and/or career opportunities.** Students will be advised that requirements for a second bachelor degree or a certificate may exceed the minimum 54 upper division credits required for the Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration with a Concentration in Justice Administration under this articulation agreement.

In order to facilitate the transfer of students, Honolulu Community College agrees to identify AAS in Administration of Justice students who have completed the UH-West O'ahu Articulation Option with a letter of notification from the Honolulu Community College Registrar.


