**Graduation Requirements**

- 64 credits for Associate of Science Degree (AS).
- All CA courses must be completed with a "C" or higher.
- 2.0 cumulative grade point average.
- Proficiency requirement:** completion of ENG 20BCDE or place higher than ENG 20BCDE on the placement test & completion of MATH 20bcd or place higher than MATH 20BCD on the placement test. MATH 21 does not meet this requirement.
- Residency requirement:** The final twelve (12) credits in the major must be earned at HCC. This requirement may be waived. See an academic counselor for more information.
- When there is a break in enrollment for more than one year, you must use the graduation requirements in effect at the time of graduation.
- Submit graduation application by March 15 for Spring semester and by October 15 for Fall semester. There is no graduation in the summer.
